

Birds

This week, Year 4 have been learning about common garden birds and why it is important to feed them in the winter months.





After that, we went outside to see if we could see or hear any birds. There were lots of sparrows in the hedge along the EYFS field. We also saw a **blackbird**, a pair of **robins** and some **seagulls** in the sky.

We talked about what food different types of birds like to eat. We agreed that birds of prey like eagles eat small

animals, seagulls like to eat fish (as well as anything else they can find!) but smaller birds like to eat seeds, berries and insects.

The problem is that in the winter, many insects have died or are hibernating and most of the seeds and



berries produced in autumn have been eaten already. So

there is not much food around for the birds and they are at risk of starving!

So we decided to make the birds around school some tasty food to eat. We threaded wire hoops with Cheerios



(made of grains), raisins (like berries) and cheese (containing fats and protein like in insects).



When they were complete, we hung the bird feeders around the school gardens making sure they were high enough off the ground so the birds couldn't be attacked by **predators**.





Luckily we made some extra bird feeders to take home so that the children could feed the birds in their own gardens!

I'm sure all the birds in Cadishead will be very grateful for the food we have provided for them.
