Attainment is used to compare school with other schools nationally. In Reading and Mathematics a Scale Score of 100 is the Expected Standard. A Scale score of over 110 indicates a learner achieving at a higher standard. In Writing the teacher assesses if a learner is At or above the Expected standard.

The government *Floor target* is for at least 65% of children to achieve this in all three subjects.
